Previous Employment History

Neil was based in Shanghai for nearly 5 years, conducting various casualty investigations – cargo loss and/or damage, groundings, collisions, fires, personal injury, pollution, etc. He frequently advised Owners, assisting with the supervision of the loading of various steel product cargoes, and cargo interests with the loading of a series of trains for Australia and the loading of various project / heavy lift cargoes.

On his return to the UK, Neil continued with various casualty investigations, speed and consumption assessments, Hong Kong Flag State Quality Inspections, groundings, collisions, container loss incidents, personal injury cases, etc. He has been involved with the investigation of a number of drug and migrant crossing cases.

Working for the Loss Prevention department, inspecting the Club's entered vessels and producing risk profiles of those vessels using Bowtie software. Assisted with other Loss Prevention initiatives.
